## Caring For Your Acrylic Nails

OK so you've got a new set of acrylic nails, they look great but here's how to care for these puppies, after all you paid good money for them and want them to last.

- Never cut your acrylic nails, they will shatter. File them only.
- Use a non acetone nail polish remover (if you want to remove your nails we soak them in acetone so I guess polish remover with acetone in it wouldn't be good)
- To clean the nails underneath use a soft tooth brush and soak them in steradent (the stuff for false teeth .....apparently)
- As the nail grows there may be a small ridge where the acrylic meets your natural nail, this ridge needs to be buffed down to blend with your natural nail to prevent any lifting. This can be done yourself at home or we can do this service for you. It's called a buff & polish and is recommended to keep your nails looking good inbetween refills.
- Try to avoid picking at your nails because that will just promote more lifting, if you do have any lifting bits you're better off buffing them down with a nail file.
- Most people have a refill about every 4 weeks, this is where we back fill more acrylic onto the natural nail where it has grown out. We also move the white French line further down the nail if you had a French set, otherwise it would eventually disappear off the end of your finger.
