Young healthy looking skin does not have a build up of dead skin cells on the surface, it has a glow to it. Chemical peeling uses products, typically acids which remove and force the regeneration of the skin, especially in the outer layer.

Benefits of regular peels:

- Improve the freshness, smoothness and colour of the complexion.
- Improves acne, congestion and blocked pores
- Reduces the appearance of fine lines and wrinkles
- Can assist with the absorption of other products following a peel
- Improves the texture of the skin and stimulates collagen renewal
- Can improve superficial scarring and irregular pigmentation

Regular light peels will generally benefit all skin types from teenage acne to mature skin.

Let's compare Microdermabrasion with Peels

Like Microdermabrasion, peels remove dead skin cells, peels however also use active agents to penetrate into the deeper levels of the skin. Peels also contain skin lightening and hydrating ingredients. Peels do not perform lymphatic drainage. Peels and Microdermabrasion complement one another. Microdermabrasion allows a deep exfoliation and cleanse of the surface of the skin, assisting the active ingredients of a peel to penetrate more deeply.

At Raptcha'u we offer 2 types of chemical peels. Both are intended to be very superficial peels. The major difference is that with one there is visible peeling, and with the other there is no visible peeling.

- The Gp40 peel \$80
40% glycolic peel – no visible flaking
Additional ingredients have been included in this peel such as Melfade, which assist with skin lightening and Cromist HYA, which contains hyaluronic acid to help maintain skin hydration immediately following the peel
- The JP7 peel \$95
Is a modified Jessner Peel & you may experience visible flaking for 5-10 days after the peel. This peel also contains Melfade to assist with reducing pigmentation. This is a great peel for sun damaged skin.

Which peel to have? Basically do you want to have visible peeling or not?

How deep do you want to go? Generally you go deeper with the JP7 Peel
It really depends on the general condition of the skin. The GP40 is more for younger skin, the JP7 for sun damaged skin.
